PLM2007 2nd Circular

The leitmotif of the 38th PLM is "Linguistic topics at the start of the new century: an overview". The aim of PLM 2007 is to provide an overview of current topics in linguistics in the first decade of the 21st century. Proposals of papers in any field of modern linguistics are welcome. The participants will be offered a tour of the 10th century Gniezno Cathedral, the Archdiocesan Museum as well as the Museum of the Origins of the Polish State.
